A Year of HELP for

24 February 2022: Russia invades Ukraine.



3 March 2022: First meeting with Father Mykhaylo Chaban, SDB, from Lviv and Father Štefan Kormančík, SDB, from Slovakia to coordinate relief efforts for Ukrainian refugees and those still in the country.

25 February 2022: Jugend Eine Welt issues the first appeal for donations to help the people in Ukraine.



6 March 2022: Support provided to the Don Bosco Sisters who are helping refugees on the Polish and Slovakian borders.



10 March 2022: The Jugend Eine Welt partners in the Moldovan capital Chişinău turn their Don Bosco youth centre into emergency accommodation for refugees from their neighbouring country.



May 2022: The rapidly changing circumstances and uncertainty about how the war will develop prompt Jugend Eine Welt to direct funds to where they are most urgently needed in coordination with other funding agencies. In Chişinău, for instance, an ADA PLUS project is launched in which Jugend Eine Welt project partners help in cooperation with CONCORDIA partners.

April 2022: Our partners in Ukraine and the neighbouring countries Poland, Slovakia, Romania and Moldova work tirelessly to help those who have fled.



1 April 2022: Jugend Eine Welt sends relief coordinator Wolfgang Wedan to the war-torn regions. He drives first of all to the partners in Chişinău, Moldova, in a car donated by MIVA Austria.

13 June 2022: A lorry laden in Upper Austria with 7,670 kilos of relief supplies reaches the Don Bosco Sisters in the Ukrainian port of Odessa, accompanied by relief coordinator Wolfgang Wedan. The urgently needed medicines and medical supplies are a huge help to the doctors at the children's hospital there: babies can again receive the care they need. At the same time, the Slovakian project partner SAVIO also delivers tonnes of relief supplies – from food to emergency power generators – to Lviv by lorry. From here they are dispatched all over Ukraine.

14 March 2022: Hundreds of refugees, chiefly women and children, find emergency accommodation in facilities run by the Salesians of Don Bosco and the Don Bosco Sisters in Kyiv, Lviv, Zhytomyr, Dnipropetrovsk, Novosilka, Odessa, Peremyshliany and Birka. They are given food and items such as sleeping bags, foam mattresses, dressing material and toiletries. Home-made bread is distributed to those in need all over the country. Jugend Eine Welt supports its partners' efforts.



From prompt emergency supplies of

Since the war broke out, the Austrian aid organisation Jugend Eine Welt has been supporting its project and cooperation partners in Ukraine and the neighbouring countries Moldova, Romania, Slovakia and Poland in their dedicated efforts to help those in need of protection. It is of crucial importance to us to focus on mothers and children so that we can help them through this terrible time as well as possible. After one year of „help for Ukraine“ there is one sad certainty: the crisis is far from over.

These pages present a “timeline” of the most important milestones that summarises how and where we have hel-

ped so far. The back page has a detailed list of the donated funds that we have forwarded to our partners. Our quarterly dossiers, available at www.jugendeinewelt.at/ukrainehilfe, provide more details of what we are doing to help Ukraine.

During the first months of the war, the emergency relief provided by Jugend Eine Welt and partners from our extensive network such as the Salesians of Don Bosco (SDB) and the Don Bosco Sisters (FMA) in Ukraine, Moldova, Romania, Slovakia and Poland focused on rapid and efficient distribution of essential supplies to refugees. These included accommodation, food, toiletries

War Refugees



July 2022: At summer camps in Moldova and Romania, Ukrainian children and young people let off steam by taking part in games, sports and a wide range of creative activities. They also receive psychological support. In Slovakia and Poland, refugees are given not only a place to stay, but the chance to attend language courses and workshops as well. Help is given to women looking for work, and special programmes are organised for children.



24 August 2022: Thanks to the large number of donors, endowments and private companies, Jugend Eine Welt has been able to make approximately **one million euros** available to its partners since the war began. One of the things this sum makes possible is the establishment of a psychosocial centre for minors in the Posticum cultural centre in Oradea, Romania.



December 2022: Jugend Eine Welt establishes a permanent coordination office in Chişinău. Martin Kunze (seen in the photo with the bishop at the blessing of the office) replaces Wolfgang Wedan as relief coordinator after eight months. At the same time, the new humanitarian aid project SECURE (Setting up Action for Ukraine Emergency) begins. It is supported by Nachbar in Not and the Austrian Development Agency and is scheduled to run until March 2024. It aims to help internally displaced persons in Ukraine, Ukrainian refugees temporarily stuck in Moldova and Moldovan families at risk of poverty.



October 2022: Two Senior Experts from Jugend Eine Welt, Martina Sordian and Wolfgang Moser, support the work being done by project partners in the Moldovan capital Chişinău.



24 September 2022: The second consignment of relief supplies safely reaches heavily bombed Odessa. It again includes vital medical supplies for the children's hospital such as a respirator for premature babies. In Lviv, where the number of internally displaced persons is gradually falling, 5 tonnes of medicine have already been delivered to hospitals in the city and the surrounding area.



Christmas 2022: Just before Christmas, a lorry with 1.500 Christmas parcels arrives in Chişinău – sent by an action group in Allgäu, southern Germany.



Early January 2023: More consignments of relief supplies have arrived in Odessa. They include another lorry laden with medicine and medical equipment for the children's hospital. The hospital is now being supported with funds from the Else Kröner-Fresenius Foundation, World Doctors South Tyrol and the Weisses Kreuz. A second lorry carrying food parcels and 1.000 pairs of winter shoes manufactured by the Lower Austrian firm of GEA trundles straight to the Don Bosco Sisters who distribute everything among refugees and local families.



February 2023: The next lorry loads of medical supplies for the children's hospital arrive in Odessa along with power banks, inverter power generators and large power generators. After one year of war, Jugend Eine Welt has disbursed just over **2 million euros** to its dedicated partners.

and medicine. For internally displaced persons as well as for those who found refuge in neighbouring countries. However, it soon became apparent that this emergency aid would need to be transformed into long-term and more comprehensive forms of support for people who have fled their homes.

Jugend Eine Welt met this new challenge by appointing a relief coordinator whose job it is to visit the affected areas and ascertain the different local needs, define the measures to be taken and set them in motion in collaboration with the partners on the ground. Several consignments of essential supplies

were organised and taken by lorry from Austria and Slovakia chiefly to Ukraine and Moldova. Towards the end of 2022, a permanent coordination office was set up and a new large-scale humanitarian relief project was launched in Ukraine and Moldova that is scheduled to run for 16 months. This and other programmes will be a major preoccupation of Jugend Eine Welt and its partners during the second year of the war which sadly seems inevitable.
