Your contact is the president of a local NGO that fights against child and labour abuse. Many neighbours report unfair situations on the company's cocoa plantations. She gives you a list of everything she has detected in recent days.

Record of documented abuses in the last month.

Cocoa plantation, Uganda

- Three women reported being victims of sexual harassment or assault by supervisors.
- One 14-year-old girl was forced to work through the night. She fainted due to physical exhaustion.
- Two minors were physically assaulted with sticks for not keeping up with the required pace.
- One child disappeared several weeks ago. No official investigation has yet been launched.
- Eight female workers reported feeling watched or harassed when seeking privacy in the toilets.
- Five young people did not receive their wages after rejecting inappropriate advances from a superior.
- One female worker suffered a broken arm. She did not receive adequate medical care.
- One worker was prohibited from rest and dialogue among other minors, as well as physical punishment, has been documented.
- One 11-year-old minor was punished and detained for taking food from the plantation, presumably because he was hungry.
- Twenty cases of degrading verbal treatment, especially towards women and adolescents.

This report has been compiled by the local team based on direct and confidential testimonies.

We continue to document cases and provide support to victims, despite threats and institutional silence.
