Besides the expansion of our disaster relief measures, the central Jugend Eine Welt agenda – improving the lives of young people all over the world in accordance with our guiding principle of “Education overcomes poverty” – also continued with undiminished intensity, and this is **chiefly thanks to you!** For this reason, I would like to take this opportunity to express my **most heartfelt gratitude** to you for your unstinting loyalty and solidarity over the years. These become particularly evident through your increased financial support in times of crisis and disaster. Without your support we cannot help those who need urgent assistance.

Details of the concrete measures we took to help those who fled the country – especially the women and children – and to support those who remained there in the first **year of the war in Ukraine** can be found on pages 6 – 7. Life-saving disaster relief was needed not only in Europe, but in other parts of the world too, such as **Tigray in Ethiopia** where civil war is raging. In addition to this, we continued – together with our project partners – to oversee the ongoing **education projects** for disadvantaged children and young people in many countries of the South and to launch new initiatives.

2022 was not only marked by a great deal of work, but also gave us an opportunity, in the middle of the year, for a little celebration: the **25th anniversary of our foundation**. Turn to pages 8 – 9 to see pictures of this event.

It is with some pride that I can look back on the **past 25 years**. We have achieved a great deal and I have become convinced of one thing: many committed people are needed who actively contribute to making schooling and professional training for children and young people at risk around the world a reality. For a fairer ONE world where all people can live a good life in dignity. Every little helps.

REVIEW OF 2022



A year of crises old and new

Overcoming old, recurring and new crises. That sums up the bulk of the work done by Jugend Eine Welt in 2022. An example of an “old” crisis was the subsiding Covid pandemic, while renewed outbreaks of famine and natural disasters caused by climate change gave us a sense of déjà-vu. The Russian war of aggression against Ukraine was a new crisis.

As in previous years, **emergency humanitarian aid and disaster relief** made up a large part of our work. Quite simply, it was important to us to offer support, in cooperation with our project partners, to children, young people and their families who, through no fault of their own, find themselves in difficulty. This is resource-intensive work. In addition, we once again succeeded not only in maintaining the “classic” development cooperation associated with Jugend Eine Welt, but also in adding new projects to it here and there.

In 2022, we oversaw, carried out or launched a total of **around 183 projects in 53 countries**. 31 projects were at the preparatory stage including 9 follow-up projects in Ukraine, the Republic of Moldova and Romania in connection with our aid for Ukraine. Some examples of these projects and programmes are described below.

Famine aid, organic farming, health care, environmental protection

Apart from Ukraine, other areas hit by disasters were not forgotten. Among these, particular efforts were made to help in the **Ethiopian region of Tigray** where the civil war that broke out in 2020 repeatedly flares up. After months of blockades in the country, which is also suffering a severe drought, lorries were finally able to get through to the communities in distress from July, bringing them urgently needed relief supplies and food. Before the civil war broke out, Jugend Eine Welt helped its project partners set up training courses in solar engineering. The now-abandoned workshops are being used for aid activities and to store food for the local population. A new location – Nepal – was added to the **“Back To Nature” programme** for sustainable farming supported by Jugend Eine Welt and developed in cooperation with partners in India, Sierra Leone, Uganda and the Philippines. The programme has the aim of educating local communities in organic farming, offering them support and reducing the use of farming methods that harm the environment and the people themselves.

An important component of the **Family Clinic** construction project supported by Jugend Eine Welt and the organisation Verein Freunde Anna Dengel and run by the Medical Mission Sisters in Kulmasa, one of the poorest regions in northern Ghana, has been completed: a mobile unit now regularly tours the region, where health care is scarce, offering the villagers out-patient treatment, medical check-ups, health education and advice on nutrition for expectant mothers and infants.

The **reafforestation programme** launched by the “Fondo Ecuatoriano Populorum Progressio” and the indigenous Secoya people in the relatively sparsely populated Amazon lowlands of Ecuador promotes environmental protection. Drilling for oil and mining have resulted in extensive deforestation in the region. The programme’s objectives include sustainable land use and creating alternative sources of income for the local population.

Day for Street Children live on YouTube

Don Bosco Sister Hanni Denifl has been working for disadvantaged children and young people in West Africa for over 15 years. For the Day for Street Children, this longtime Jugend Eine Welt partner came to events in Vienna and Innsbruck to talk about her work. Because of Covid, only a handful of people were able to attend the conversations with director Reinhard Heiserer in person, but a large number followed them via a live stream on our YouTube channel.



Numerous visits from project partners

In the year marking the anniversary of Jugend Eine Welt's foundation, a large number of project partners came to Vienna. Among them were Andisiwe Mbelekane and Jonas Schumacher from the partner organisation Masifunde in Gqeberha (formerly Port Elizabeth) in South Africa. Masifunde accompanies socially disadvantaged teenagers during their professional training and helps them look for work. Jonas, the founder and director, gave an account of the challenges currently facing their work together with Andisiwe, one of the youngsters who successfully completed the programme.



Austria's ambassador to India visits school project

In India's capital, Delhi, a project supported by Jugend Eine Welt was afforded a very special honour: Austria's ambassador to India, Katharina Weiser, visited the "Back to School" programme through which 100 children have been rescued from the streets. The embassy itself also supports this important project. "Education is the only way to achieve a better life," Weiser explained.



Children's book campaign in aid of Ukraine

Authors and publishers of children's books in Austria help Jugend Eine Welt to help in Ukraine! This charity campaign, organised by six Austrian publishers of books for children and young people, offered valuable original illustrations and signed books for sale and staged events such as readings. The entire proceeds, which came to several thousand euros, went to aid for Ukraine.

Voices Against Child Labour

As part of the "Stop Child Labour" campaign, the volunteers hosted an informative online event in February: "Voices Against Child Labour". At the event, Father Rubin Mathew and Sister Hanni Denifl talked about their work and efforts to promote children's rights in India and Benin. The event, which took place in the evening before the outbreak of war in Ukraine, also included a debate on supply chain legislation against child labour.



20 years of the Donation Seal of Approval

Jugend Eine Welt received a marvellous accolade at the OSGS Forum 2022 on the occasion of the "20th birthday party" for the Austrian Donation Seal of Approval which had been delayed somewhat by Covid: Jugend Eine Welt - Don Bosco Entwicklungszusammenarbeit was recognised for having been entitled to use the seal without interruption ever since it was introduced in 2001.



The big WeltWegWeiser volunteers' conference

In March, the big WeltWegWeiser volunteers' conference "Alle(s) Inklusive? Nur wie ...?" ("All Inclusive... But How?") was held at the Europahaus in Vienna. Its workshops and talks covered the topics of diversity, inclusion and global justice. A set of methods developed by WeltWegWeiser, the service point for voluntary assignments abroad run by Jugend Eine Welt, was also presented to show how people with a handicap can be involved in processes involving group dynamics, including, of course, those relating to periods of voluntary work abroad.



Philanthropy needs volunteers: Event at Palais Coburg

Distinguished speakers and a large audience: both were in attendance at the conference "Philanthropie braucht Ehrenamt" ("Philanthropy needs volunteers") in Vienna's Palais Coburg. The conference was organised by the Jugend Eine Welt Not-for-profit Private Foundation with the association Verband für gemeinnütziges Stiften and was made possible by the POK Pühringer Privatstiftung. Experts in endowments talked about the role played by honorary staff members in running a foundation's activities. Jugend Eine Welt's honorary ambassador Chris Lohner also attended the conference.





Send-off party for 17 new volunteers

Looking at the bigger picture, reflecting on one's own set of values or helping to achieve a fairer world for all: these are some of the motives that prompt many young people to do a period of voluntary work abroad with "Volontariat bewegt", the initiative run by Jugend Eine Welt and the Salesians of Don Bosco. In July alone, 17 young volunteers who had completed their period of preparation were given a celebratory send-off in Vienna, shortly before they started their assignment on a project.

Two TV documentaries on "anniversary projects"

In Lagos, Nigeria's biggest city, the Salesians of Don Bosco are building a new children's shelter that gives socially disadvantaged children the chance to go to school. In and around Kulmasa in northern Ghana – an area where health care is in short supply – the Medical Mission Sisters are building a small family clinic. These two "anniversary projects" receive funding from Jugend Eine Welt, and director Reinhard Heiserer visited them in the spring. He was joined by Zoran Dobrić, a journalist with Austrian broadcaster ORF, who filmed a documentary about each project. The documentaries were then shown on Austrian national television.



Make-your-own school-starters' goody cone

On their very first day at school, children in Austria are traditionally given a large cone filled with goodies – the "Schultüte". Jugend Eine Welt launched its make-your-own "Schultüte" campaign when term began, and the templates with the message "Learning is fun" are still available for download at jugendeinewelt.at (search term "Bastelvorlage").



Buying Zotter chocolate supports education projects

A better future through education and one hot meal a day. That is what 770 schoolchildren in Madagascar are receiving thanks to the project "Schokolade macht Schule" (roughly, "Chocolate goes to school") supported by the chocolate-making firm of Zotter and Jugend Eine Welt. For every chocolate banana sold, 50 cents go to education projects. CEO Josef Zotter is happy to be able to support the operation of nine elementary schools on the island in this way, since it is where the high-quality organic cocoa that the family-run company buys at fair prices comes from. The "Schokolade macht Schule" brand is available in high-street shops and the Jugend Eine Welt online shop.

Solar power for pupils from the school roof

In the summer we had encouraging news from Uganda: 30 youngsters who had completed the Jugend Eine Welt solar engineering training scheme have installed a 5-kW array on the roof of the elementary school in Namugongo. Sudden power cuts are now consigned to history once and for all and the pupils can concentrate on their lessons with no exasperating interruptions.



Large annual get-together for volunteers

How can peace be achieved despite great tensions? That was one of the topics that the participants focused on at the big annual gathering of Jugend Eine Welt volunteers in Tulln in October. Volunteers from the education teams joined Senior Experts and other interested parties to spend a weekend of talks and workshops on topics relating to development policy. The guest speakers provided stimulating input.



Award for development cooperation in medicine

Broad smiles were to be seen one October evening in Berlin: the Else Kröner-Fresenius award for development cooperation in medicine was presented to Dr. Rita Schiffer, a gynaecologist, Medical Mission Sister and head of Attat Hospital in Ethiopia. The Freunde Anna Dengel and Jugend Eine Welt – both longtime supporters of the hospital – nominated Sr. Rita for this award at the Else Kröner Fresenius Foundation (EKFS). The award is worth EUR 100,000 and thus one of the most valuable for development cooperation in medicine.



Great honour for Jugend Eine Welt

Jugend Eine Welt was the recipient of a great honour from the Senat der Wirtschaft. This politically independent association of companies awarded the development organisation the "Intercultural Future Award" at its traditional end-of-year conference in Schloss Mondsee. With the award, the association recognised Jugend Eine Welt's 25-year dedication under the motto of "Education overcomes poverty".



HELP FOR THE PEOPLE FROM AND IN

Since war broke out in Ukraine on 24 February 2022, Jugend Eine Welt has been supporting its project and cooperation partners in Ukraine and the neighbouring countries Moldova, Romania, Slovakia and Poland in their dedicated efforts to help those in need of protection. It has always been of crucial importance to us to focus on mothers and children so that we can help them through this terrible time as well as possible. The initial vague hope of a rapid end to the conflict was unfortunately soon dashed.

On these pages we look back at the most important relief measures undertaken in 2022 by, with and through Jugend Eine Welt. From emergency aid to continuous support

During the first months of 2022, the emergency relief provided by Jugend Eine Welt and partners from our extensive network such as the Salesians of Don Bosco (SDB) and the Don Bosco Sisters (FMA) in Ukraine, Moldova, Romania, Slovakia and Poland focused on rapid and efficient distribution of essential supplies to refugees. These included accommodation, food, toiletries and medicine. For internally displaced persons as well as for those who found refuge in neighbouring countries. However, it soon became apparent that this emergency aid would need to be transformed into long-term and more comprehensive forms of support for people who have fled their homes as well as those who have stayed in Ukraine.

Initially, a “mobile” relief coordinator was appointed to travel to Ukraine and the neighbouring countries and ascertain the different local needs, define the measures to be taken and set them in motion in collaboration with the partners. At the end of 2022, however, a permanent coordination office was set up in Chişinău, capital of the Republic of Moldova. This made it possible to coordinate activities, such as new relief programmes, even more efficiently. It also benefited the deliveries of essential supplies that, since the summer of 2022, have regularly been taken by lorry from Austria and Slovakia to Moldova and chiefly to Ukraine.

Thanks and a request

March 2022: Hundreds of refugees, chiefly women and children, find **emergency accommodation** in facilities run by the Salesians of Don Bosco and the Don Bosco Sisters in Kyiv, Lviv, Zhytomyr, Dnipropetrovsk, Novosilka, Odessa, Peremyshliany and Birka. They are given food and items such as sleeping bags, foam mattresses, dressing material and toiletries. Home-made bread is distributed to those in need all over the country. Jugend Eine Welt supports its partners' efforts.

Coordinator:

At the beginning of April, Jugend Eine Welt sends **relief coordinator** Wolfgang Wedan to the regions affected by the crisis. He drives first of all to the partners in Chişinău, Moldova, in a car donated by MIVA Austria. In the weeks that follow, Wedan also visits the Jugend Eine Welt partners in Romania and Poland. He organises deliveries of relief supplies and plans long-term programmes of support with the partners there.



April 2022: Our partners in Ukraine and the neighbouring countries Poland, Slovakia, Romania and Moldova work tirelessly to help those who have fled, providing accommodation and taking care of the children.



UKRAINE SINCE THE WAR BROKE OUT

In **Austria**, the humanitarian crisis in Ukraine has prompted many companies here to support the aid Jugend Eine Welt is helping to send to Ukraine. One of the first of these is the **Plansee Group** based in Reutte, Tyrol. In April, the internationally operating industrial firm makes a donation of EUR 500,000. "We've been aware of Jugend Eine Welt for a long time and know that our contribution is in good hands with them," explained Karlheinz Wex, the board spokesman.



July 2022: At **summer camps** in Moldova and Romania, Ukrainian children and young people let off steam by taking part in games, sports and a wide range of creative activities. They also receive psychological support. In Slovakia and Poland, refugees are given not only a place to stay, but the chance to attend language courses and workshops as well. Help is given to women looking for work, and special programmes are organised for children.



May 2022: The rapidly changing circumstances and uncertainty about how the war will develop prompt Jugend Eine Welt to direct **funds** to where they are most urgently needed in coordination with other funding agencies. In Chişinău, for instance, an ADA PLUS project is launched in which Jugend Eine Welt project partners help in cooperation with CONCORDIA partners.



August 2022: **Thanks** to the large number of donors, endowments and private companies, Jugend Eine Welt can offer many different kinds of support to its partners on the ground. It is possible, for example, to establish a psychosocial centre for minors in the Posticum cultural centre in Oradea, Romania.



24. September 2022: The second consignment of relief supplies safely reaches **heavily bombed** Odessa. It again includes vital medical supplies for the children's hospital such as a respirator for premature babies. In Lviv, where the number of internally displaced persons is gradually falling, 5 tonnes of medicine have already been delivered to hospitals in the city and the surrounding area.

December 2022: Jugend Eine Welt establishes a permanent **coordination office** in Chişinău. Martin Kunze (see photo below) takes over from emergency coordinator Wolfgang Wedan after eight months. At the same time, the humanitarian aid project SECURE (Setting up Action for Ukraine Emergency) begins. It is supported by Nachbar in Not and the Austrian Development Agency and is scheduled to run until March 2024. It aims to help internally displaced persons in Ukraine, Ukrainian refugees temporarily stuck in Moldova and Moldovan families at risk of poverty.



Early 2023: More aid shipments arrive in Odessa. They include another lorry laden with medicine and medical equipment for the children's hospital. The hospital is now being supported with funds from the Else Kröner-Fresenius Foundation, World Doctors South Tyrol and the Weisses Kreuz. A second lorry carrying food parcels and **1,000 pairs of winter shoes** manufactured by the Lower Austrian firm of GEA trundles straight to the Don Bosco Sisters who distribute everything among refugees and local families.



A year of war: The next lorry loads of medical supplies for the children's hospital, plus power banks, inverter power generators and large power generators, arrive in Odessa and Chişinău from February 2023. After one year of war, Jugend Eine Welt has disbursed just over **2 MILLION EUROS** to its dedicated partners.



13 June 2022: A lorry laden in Upper Austria with 7,670 kilos of **relief supplies** reaches the Don Bosco Sisters in the Ukrainian port of Odessa, accompanied by relief coordinator Wolfgang Wedan. The urgently needed medicines and medical supplies are a huge help to the doctors at the **children's hospital** there: babies can again receive the care they need. At the same time, the Slovakian project partner SAVIO also delivers tonnes of relief supplies – from food to emergency power generators – to Lviv by lorry. From here they are dispatched all over Ukraine.

On this particular day, it was not the usual improvised performances that were played out on the stage of the Tschaunerbühne open-air theatre in Vienna. Instead, a big party was held with a great deal of talking. Some of it was definitely spontaneous, off the cuff, and often had words of praise and gratitude thrown in. These were addressed to the “main attraction” as it celebrated its silver jubilee on 24 June, 2022.

25 years ago almost to the day, on 28 June, 1997, Reinhard Heiserer and a small group who shared his vision founded Jugend Eine Welt in Vienna. An organisation which, over the years and following its guiding principle of “Education overcomes poverty”, has become one of Austria’s most important aid organisations in the field of development cooperation. Reason enough to stage a celebration followed by a convivial get-together with around 250 guests including many longtime project partners from all over the world as well as friends, supporters, benefactors and representatives of foundations.

“Very many dedicated people are needed who are committed to promoting the rights of children and young people all over the world, who rescue them from potentially harmful situations and give them a chance to go to school and learn a trade,” declared director Reinhard Heiserer in his address. He thanked all those who “have accompanied us on this journey so far”, adding a request to continue to do so in future.

Recognition

The official part of the celebration was hosted by Chris Lohner, Jugend Eine Welt’s honorary ambassador, and included short talks by project partners who took the stage to present their work and the situation of young people in their particular country. In these talks, a great deal of praise for the work done by Jugend Eine Welt was heard. For example, Father Noel Maddhichetty, SDB, stated: “Thanks to the help that Jugend Eine Welt has been providing for so long we have been able to look after around 200,000 street children in the shelters run by the Salesians in 72 cities all over India and organise schooling for them.”

The crucial role that education for young people plays in “sustainable global development” was explained by the keynote speaker, university professor Wolfgang Lutz. The founding director of the Wittgenstein Centre for Demography and Global Human Capital presented the latest research findings from his dossier, which was commissioned in 2021 by the Yidan Prize Foundation in association with the Wittgenstein Centre and was first published in German by Jugend Eine Welt in Austria (download at jugendeinewelt.at, enter the search term “Lutz”).

Investing in children’s education is best of all

In his talk, Lutz summed up “40 years of research on education” in a number of key points. For instance, education improves the ability to abstract as well as physical health. It helps combat poverty and hunger because it enables people to help themselves and others more effectively. Education leads to greater knowledge, understanding and prudence. It leads to “better adaptation to already inevitable climate change”. Education reveals its effects slowly, but surely. Of all possible investments, investing “in children’s education, if possible before they even start school, is the best of all.”

For Reinhard Heiserer, these observations were both confirmation of the work done by Jugend Eine Welt and a call to continue it, although the recent global crises make it particularly challenging: “On the one hand, we are increasingly doing short-term humanitarian relief work, and on the other we must continue to invest in long-term development cooperation projects.”

Tremendous dedication, optimism and great endurance will be needed in the next 25 years.

Jugend Eine Welt's work in selected figures

Projects, media activities, volunteer assignments, education work, voluntary work in Austria in 2022



50 and more newspaper articles or radio and TV reports dealt with the work done by Jugend Eine Welt and associated current events in 2022. The most requests for an interview were addressed to **Chris Lohner, Jugend Eine Welt's honorary ambassador, relief coordinator Wolfgang Wedan** who is working in Ukraine, and **director Reinhard Heiserer**.



3.000 different projects (such as schools, universities, vocational training institutions, social centres, homes for street children) and programmes (for girls and women and for sustainable poverty reduction and environmental initiatives) were carried out, supported, continued or developed further by **Jugend Eine Welt in its first quarter of a century** in many countries in Asia, Africa, Latin America, the Middle East and Eastern Europe. In addition, Jugend Eine Welt provided **humanitarian aid following natural disasters, outbreaks of famine or during armed conflicts**. Among these were the catastrophic earthquakes in Pakistan, Haiti, Nepal and Ecuador; **the ebola outbreak** in Sierra Leone; famines in South Sudan and Ethiopia; during the Covid pandemic and currently in Ukraine.



800 young adults from Austria have undertaken a **voluntary assignment** on an education or social project somewhere in the world during the past 25 years. Making these voluntary assignments possible is one of the ideas that led to the foundation of Jugend Eine Welt.

12 project partners from all over the world who came to Austria for the 25th anniversary of Jugend Eine Welt gave in-depth interviews to director Reinhard Heiserer about their education and social projects that pave the way for children and young people in need to escape from poverty. All the **video recordings** of these "fireside chats" are on our **website** in the section "25 Jahre Jugend Eine Welt".

4 of the **17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)** formulated by the United Nations are of **particular importance** to us when choosing projects. The focus is on ending poverty, no hunger, health and well-being and quality education for all.

52 voluntary staff members in Austria did unpaid work of various kinds for Jugend Eine Welt in 2022. This included working in one of the education teams, helping at events in which the organisation was involved or performing office duties.

11 Senior Expert assignments were organised by Jugend Eine Welt in 2022. People with professional experience and experience of life contributed their knowledge and expertise to one of the projects supported by Jugend Eine Welt.

1.200 hours of office work of all kinds were done by volunteers at the aid organisation's headquarters.


